**Q: What curriculum opportunities are there for high school placement?** We plan to offer high school credit placement opportunities by working with the USHS administration and the USEVS to ensure we are able to meet those requirements. Our goal is to offer high school placement in a variety of subjects including Algebra, Spanish (or another foreign language), and English.
